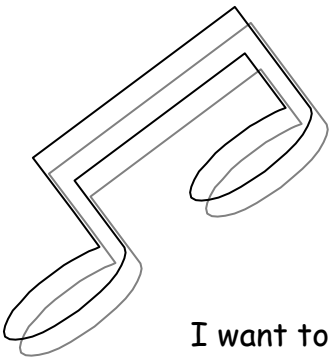
W.A.R.N SYSTEM

Harrison County Schools will be using the W.A.R.N system (Wide Area Rapid Notification) again this year. The system will enable a call to be made to every student's home in case of school closing, delays, emergencies, etc. Please be sure to provide accurate and up-to-date phone numbers. If your contact information has changed, please contact the school office.

Student Absence Information:

- Please call the absence notification number when your child is going to be absent from school. Include the child's name, grade, and teacher information on the 24-hour recording.
- Students need to turn in a note to their teacher upon the return of an absence. Include the students first and last name, dates of absence, and reason for absence on each note.
- If your child is absent and you would like to pick-up his/her homework, please call the school by 9:00AM and we will have it ready for pick-up in the office at 2:00PM. If you call after 9:00AM, it will not be ready until the next day for pick-up at 2:00PM. If you want the homework for your child, you need to call the school and not leave a message on the absence line because sometimes we cannot check it until later in the morning. Remember that each child has the same number of days to make-up missed work as the number of days absent.

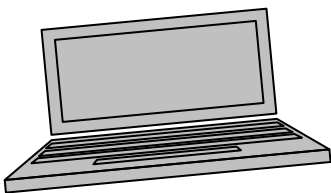
KINDERGARTEN NEWS
