Harrison County Schools Preschool Registration

Parents may pick up PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION PACKETS for the 2012-2013 school year beginning FEBRUARY 1, 2012 at the school office. Completed packets are due by MONDAY, February 13, 2012. Enrollment is limited to children who are 4-years old by September 1. If your child is eligible for Pre-K, you must submit: 1)Certified Birth Certificate 2)Immunization Record 3)Comprehensive Physical

Due to projected enrollments of K, 1, and 2, there will be a change in location for Nutter Fort Primary preschool students. Nutter Fort Primary will NOT have onsite preschool classes. All options are listed on the Pre-K packet, so please consider your needs when making your first, second and third choices. Returned packets will be recorded with date and time and priority given to the order packets are returned.

Harrison County Schools Kindergarten Registration

Nutter Fort Primary's Kindergarten registration will be Wednesday, Feb. 29th. If you have a child who will be 5 years old on or before August 31, 2012, you need to register your child for Kindergarten to ensure a place for the 2012-13 school year. Parents do not need to make an appointment.

If your child is currently enrolled in Harrison County School's Universal Pre-K program, your child does not need to attend the registration. BUT, parents need to take the required documents to the home school where your child will be attending Kindergarten on the day of registration. Your child's pre-K teacher will be able to provide you with copies of these documents, if needed. A Comprehensive Physical Form was required when entering Pre-K. An updated form is needed for Kindergarten registration. Additional immunizations may be required as well.

If your child does not currently attend a Harrison County School program, parents need to take child to their home school for Kindergarten registration At registration the child will receive a speech and language screening. Parents need to bring with them on that day the required documents.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

1. State Certified Birth Certificate (Cost: \$12.00-forms available at school)
2. Comprehensive Physical Form (form completed and signed by physician within the last 365 days)
3. Current shot record
4. Proof of residence. (Example: utility bill with physical address or a current tax receipt.)

NURSES' NOTES:

Fifth's Disease is a mild rash illness most commonly seen in children and caused by parvovirus B19. It is typically a mild illness which resolves on its own in children and adults who are otherwise healthy. Children typically have a "slapped cheek" rash on the face and a lacy, red rash on the limbs and trunk. A few days before the rash breaks out, the child may have a low fever or cold like symptoms. Treatment of symptoms such as fever, pain, or itching is usually all that is needed. Children usually are not very ill, and the rash goes away within 7 to 10 days.

During the early phase of the illness, before the rash breaks out, the infected person is contagious. The virus is spread through direct contact with respiratory secretions (e.g. saliva, sputum, nasal mucus). Frequent hand washing should be practiced to decrease the risk of spreading or becoming infected with this virus. Encourage children with cough/cold symptoms to cough or sneeze into their elbow or tissues, and dispose of used tissues. Encourage good hand washing. By the time the child breaks out with the "slapped cheek" rash, they are no longer considered contagious.

Occasionally, parvovirus B19 can cause complications in people with sickle-cell anemia or chronic anemia. There is also an occasional risk of complications from parvovirus B19 during pregnancy. If someone with anemia or a pregnant woman has been in contact with someone with Fifth's Disease or has symptoms, guidance should be sought from their physician.
